## **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the USA Cycling Mountain Bike State and Regional Championship (USA CYCLING MTB) is to recognize the best mountain bike racers in each state and region. Through the USA Cycling MTB State and Regional Championships, riders will be eligible for state and regional titles and medals, along with being able to qualify and compete at the USA Cycling Mountain Bike National Championships.

- Your event will be listed on USA Cycling's calendar

- Ability to help riders earn valuable Results and Rankings points to improve their starting spot at Nationals.

#### **DISCIPLINES**

The USA Cycling MTB State and Regional Championship recognized disciplines will follow what is recognized for Mountain Bike National Championships. These disciplines include: Cross-Country Olympic (XCO), Short-Track Cross-Country (STXC), Super Downhill (Super D), Downhill (DH), Dual Slalom (DS), Enduro, Marathon and Ultramarathon Cross-Country (MT), 6,12 and 24 Hour Cross-Country, and Cross-Country Eliminator (XCE). Fat Bike is a recognized State and Regional Championship discipline, but it will not be included as a 2019 National Championship.

#### **USA CYCLING MOUNTAIN BIKE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The USA Cycling Mountain Bike State and Regional Championships will serve as qualifiers for the USA Cycling Mountain Bike National Championships:

## **USA Cycling Mountain Bike National Championships**

July 6-12 2020 Winter Park, CO

Cross-country Olympic (XCO), Short-Track Cross-Country (STXC), Super Downhill (Super D), Downhill (DH), and Enduro

Discipline requiring qualification: XCO & DH

**Qualification period:** July 29, 2019 – July 5, 2020

The top-15 riders from each discipline, category, and age-group offered at the USA Cycling Mountain Bike National Championships and the USA Cycling MTB State and Regional Championships (same discipline and category) and will eligible to compete at the National Championships. Riders will also need to be a United States citizen or permanent resident (amateur categories only) and have a current annual USA Cycling license. ## **RACE/SERIES DIRECTOR ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

Organizations, clubs or race directors applying for a USA Cycling MTB State or Regional Championship designation must have a demonstrated ability to organize high quality, professional events. Applicants must meet the following guidelines:

- Preference will be given to established USA Cycling promoters, clubs, and organizations.
- The host organization must be a USA Cycling Race Director or member club.
- The USA Cycling club or race director must be in good financial standing with USA Cycling.
- First year race directors are generally not eligible to promote a USA Cycling State or Regional Championship, but consideration will be given to race directors who have organized other athletic events.

## RIDER ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

Riders must have an annual USA Cycling license to be eligible for State/Regional Championship medals and titles.

#### **RESULTS AND RANKINGS**

Race directors hosting a USA Cycling MTB State or Regional Championship must submit race results to USA Cycling within 24-hours of each event in the series or one-day event. All USA Cycling MTB State and Regional Championships are required to submit race results in the USA Cycling rankings categories and age-groups.

## **CHAMPIONSHIP FORMAT**

An official USA Cycling MTB State or Regional Championship follows one of two formats: Series or One-Day Event. Regardless of the format chosen, it must be clearly and openly stated in this application and in the official event announcement.

Series: A USA Cycling MTB State or Regional Championship Series includes two or more events in which riders accumulate points in the designated discipline stated on the application toward an overall total for the series. The highest ranking rider in each discipline and class and category determines the USA Cycling MTB State or Regional Champion.

One-Day Event: The USA Cycling MTB State or Regional Championship Event format may be a single event held on one day or weekend to determine the USA Cycling MTB State or Regional Champion in the designated discipline stated on the application.

State: A USA Cycling MTB State Championship event may fall within a singular State boundary or combination of States as determined by the selection Committee.

Regional: A USA Cycling MTB Regional Championship event may combine two or more states to form a Regional Championship as determined by the selection Committee.

## **CATEGORY AND AGE-GROUP REQUIREMENTS**

Race/Series Directors hosting a USA Cycling MTB State or Regional Championship are strongly encouraged to provide the minimum class and category requirements outlined in this application. USA Cycling MTB will provide medals only for Championship disciplines, categories, and age-groups. Race/Series Directors who offer non-Championship categories, disciplines, or age-groups will be responsible for providing medals for these classes.

Race/Series Directors may use five-year age groups within the 10-year age break format if they wish to do so. Riders who qualify for the USA Cycling MTB National Championships may qualify in their respective 10-year age group at a USA Cycling MTB State or Regional Championship, but they will compete in their age group as of their racing age on December 31 of the current year. Organizers may also run the current MTB National Championship categories and age-groups, as outlined in the USA Cycling Rulebook. Juniors are no longer required to qualify.
